Well they had to give me the ability to do the training as a journalist and therefore I had to be guided into that profession to have the ability to do what I did as an editor because to be an editor you have to be fairly eloquent in your knowledge of the English language because after all you are editing what ignoramuses have put forward. Well you quite often consider that they are ignoramuses in the way they put things together and then they give you a summation of 5,000 words and you have to compact it to 500.

That's actually very difficult isn't it?

It takes an art and that's the one thing that used to always strike me when I went to print out the talks from Silver Birch because they didn't require editing and if you edited them they would lose a lot of the significance and that is something that as an editor you have a great problem in doing when you have to condense things but still keep the substance of what has been said.
